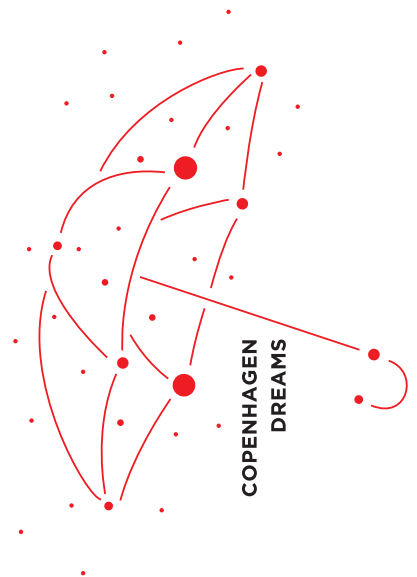

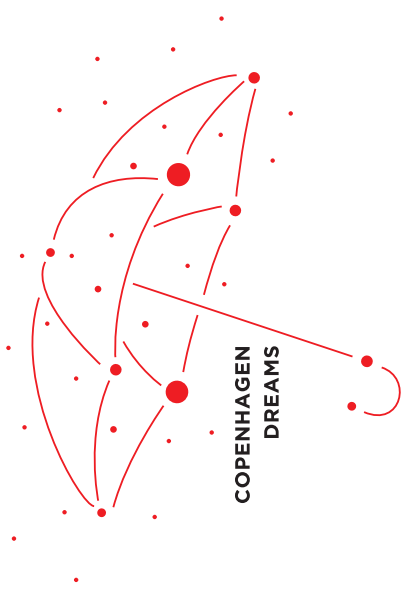

The venue of the ASD conference is the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, School of Architecture. The Academy is separated by the sea from the Copenhagen city centre, just a few hundred meters away. The conference site is part of the area called "Holmen," which from the 15th century until the early 1990s was headquarters for the Danish Navy. It is now a cultural and residential area that hosts a number of national educational institutions for the arts in the fields of architecture, film, theatre and rhythmic music, as well as the new Royal Opera House.

ACCOMMODATIONS
