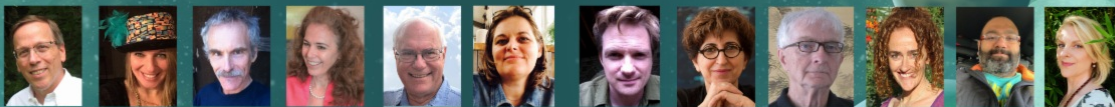

Submission Areas • High quality quantitative and qualitative research proposals are invited in areas related to dreams and dreaming, including but not limited to: the biology or neuroscience of dreaming; phenomenological and psychological studies of dreaming; and such fields as anthropological and cultural studies. Note that we still retain a small amount of dedicated funding for PTSD related research proposals as an incentive for submissions in that area of study.

Submission Deadline • October 15, 2020 for your proposal. Submissions are reviewed by a research board and selection is based on our funding limits, plus ratings on each proposal which take into account: a) value to advancing dream science; b) a solid hypothesis and research methodology; and c) risk factors related to the success of the study as proposed and Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval where appropriate. Awards are typically announced in December and include a scholarship to present the results at an upcoming IASD conference.

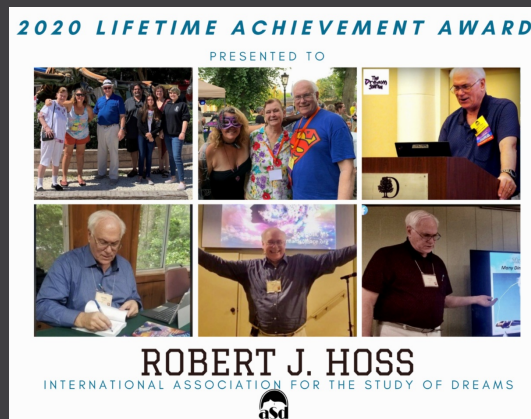
Special June Online Offerings Wrap Up

IASD would like to thank the 223 members and nonmembers who registered for the Special June Online Offerings, held on June 14-15. These online events enabled us to offer presentations originally scheduled for the 2020 IASD Conference in Scottsdale, Arizona, which had to be canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Beginning on June 14, Leslie Ellis, PhD facilitated a special Webinar presenting scheduled Keynote events by Dr. Ellis, Robert J. Hoss and Michael Nadorff, PhD. All three presenters spoke on aspects of dreams and trauma.

On Monday, June 15, the Annual IASD Membership Meeting was facilitated by Board Chair Anna-Karin Björklund. In addition to approving the minutes from the 2019 Membership Meeting, those attending the first-ever online Membership Meeting were given a special treat. Members were able to view the 2020 Presidential Address, given by IASD President Angel Morgan (see below) and, for the first time since 2009, the IASD Executive Committee granted a Lifetime Achievement Award. This is an award given to members who not only have valued IASD's work by active participation in the organization, but who have contributed to scholarly research on the subject of dreams. This year's award went to Conference Committee Chair Robert J. Hoss who, in addition to his research work and his support of the Dream Science Foundation grants for dream research, has managed IASD's annual conferences for many years. Bob Hoss's award was announced by fellow Executive Committee advisor David Kahn, PhD.

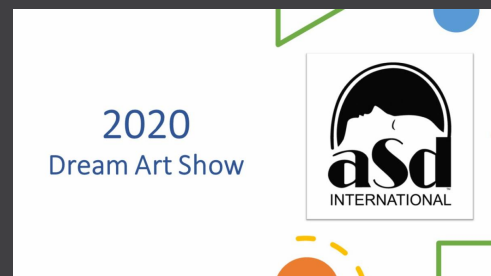


Also, newly-elected Board members were presented at the Membership Meeting. Each year, five members retire from the Board and five new members are elected by the IASD membership. This year's votes went to Katherine Bell, Linda Mastrangelo, Harry DeBont, Jeanne Van Bronkhorst and Isaac Taitz (see Board News for more details).

Two other events were presented during the Special June Online Offerings, in order to give attendees a feel for the in-person conferences generally held. Although there were no prizes awarded to artists due to the arts jury not being able to see the works in person, almost all of the artists who had submitted work to the annual Dream Art Exhibition agreed to have their works shown in a video presentation which remains online [here](#). These widely-varied pieces of art work are a beautiful contribution.

And finally, co-facilitators Robert Waggoner and Cynthia Pearson provided a Precognitive Dreaming Contest, formulated to resemble the contests held at each annual conference as well as the online PsiberDreaming Conference. This contest hosted over 70 people, with a number of correct "hits" on the randomly-selected dream target.

Reports from many attendees at the Special June Online Offerings indicated that these events provided an opportunity for people to get together via Zoom and other online formats, and were, some said, "even better" than a physical meeting. However, plans are already underway for the 2021 Conference, scheduled to be held in Ashland, Oregon.

Walter Berry, George Leute, Julie Sparrow, and Tadas Stumbrys.

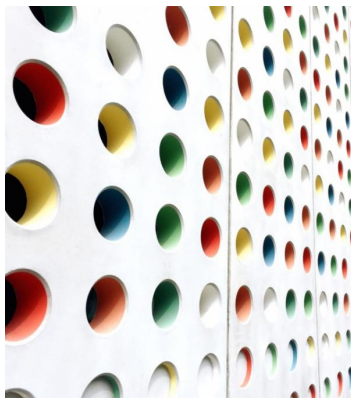

WHERE IS MY PSIBERDREAMING CONFERENCE?

POPULAR CONFERENCE CONCLUDES AN 18-YEAR RUN

IASD is sad to announce that, due to staff changes and technology changes, the popular annual PsiberDreaming Online Conference has been discontinued this year. The conference, which began in 2002, was held for two weeks each fall during September and October.



This conference was not only the first online dream conference scheduled anywhere on the Internet, but was also one of the very first conferences of any type held online. Running 24/7 for two weeks of the year, with an international attendance which grew to over 200 people annually, the conference included over 20 presentations with discussion, an Online Art Gallery, a Precognitive Dreaming Contest, the Group Psi Game, and the ever-popular Outer Inn. The conference, which began when most people involved with dream work found believing in psi or paranormal dreams to be somewhat unscientific, has more than done its part in contributing solid evidence for psi and paranormal dreaming, including dream lucidity.

This year, however, due to obstacles caused by the labor-intensive php discussion board and the need for long-term conference staff to meet other commitments, a decision was made in February 2020 that the conference needed to be retired.

We would like to thank all the many volunteers who have worked on the PsiberDreaming Conference over the years – presenters, copy editors, layout staff, technical staff, thread (room) monitors, event hosts and many others – for their diligence and commitment to IASD.

After eighteen years of online presence, the PsiberDreaming Conference will certainly be missed.

For those who are looking for an online alternative during the Fall of 2020, please note that Robert Waggoner and Ed Kellogg will be hosting a new conference, "The Worlds of Lucid Dreaming," which will be held online from October 31 through November 14, 2020.

WILLIAM DEMENT, PSYCHIATRIST KNOWN AS “THE FATHER OF SLEEP MEDICINE,” DIES AT 91

Dr. Dement conducted some of the earliest studies of rapid-eye movement sleep, known as REM, which he identified as the stage in which most dreams happen. He also revealed the phases of the sleep cycle, using electroencephalograms to monitor subjects' brain waves and polysomnography to track eye movements, blood oxygen levels, and other body functions during sleep.

Dr. Dement wrote one of the first university textbooks on sleep; founded the Stanford Sleep Disorders Clinic, considered the first of hundreds of sleep labs around the country; and created the first major professional organization for sleep researchers, now known as the American Academy of Sleep Medicine.

His research and advocacy helped awaken the medical establishment to the dangers of sleep deprivation, which Dr. Dement and his colleagues linked to fatal car crashes and ailments such as diabetes. He also spotlighted the cardiovascular risks of disorders such as sleep apnea, in which a sleeper's breathing is repeatedly interrupted.

ROBERT P. GONGLOFF'S BOOK AVAILABLE IN SPANISH AND RUSSIAN



MIT DREAM RESEARCH INTERACTS DIRECTLY WITH AN INDIVIDUAL'S DREAMING BRAIN AND MANIPULATES THE CONTENT BY SARAH BECKMANN, MASSACHUSETTS INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY

In a new paper, researchers from the Media Lab's Fluid Interfaces group introduce a novel method called “Targeted Dream Incubation” (TDI). This protocol, implemented through an app in conjunction with a wearable sleep-tracking sensor device, not only helps record dream reports, but also guides dreams toward particular themes by repeating targeted information at sleep onset, thereby enabling incorporation of this information into dream content. The TDI method and accompanying technology serve as tools for controlled experimentation in dream study, widening avenues for research into how dreams impact emotion, creativity, memory, and beyond.
